1 Introduction

1.1 Scope

 service delivery.
- Equitable and inclusive | strong consideration of the needs of all stakeholders; cCommitment to building a connection with stakeholders upon trust and respect; consideration of the needs of the broader community;; nurturing a culture of collaboration, consultation and communication in Ceouncil business practices and service delivery; fostering deeper community engagement; advance the organisational values; embracing change with an open mind and a positive culture.
- Effective and Efficient | proactive improvement to service delivery processes, adapting innovative practices in financial and asset management and service delivery including a focus of effectiveness and sustainability; clear connection between policy and implementation; improved collaboration and partnership with community, business, neighbouring councils and other government bodies.

Sustainability Environmental Health	To live within the limits of what the environment can provide, understanding the many interconnections between the economy society and the environment. Environmental health addresses the physical, chemical and biological factors external to a person, and the related factors that can potentially affect health. It is targeted towards preventing disease and creating health-supportive environments. Environmental health is a discipline of public health practice.
Ecological Sustainable Development (ESD)	ESD is defined as development that uses, conserves and enhances our natural resources so that ecological processes, and in turn the quality of life now and into the future, can be maintained.

2.1<u>3.1</u> Policy Statements

- 1) Council recognises the health of the community is intrinsically linked to the social and physical environment that exists in the shire, -and that without environmental health conditions conducive to good health, such as access to safe food, clean water, and adequate sanitation, all other public health programs and clinical interventions will be seriously undermined.
- 2) Council recognises that whilst the state and federal governments also share responsibility to ensure the health and wellbeing of the population, it is often local government that directly delivers the services that ensure environmental protection, control risks to public health, and prevent spread of infectious disease.

 - 6) Council recognises the public and environmental health impact of climate change, including the impact of alterations to rainfall pattern, temperature increase, and sea level rise on microbial and viral growth, drinking water quality, and onsite sewage/drinking water infrastructure vulnerability.

- Pprovide education and information on environmental and public health issues.

- <u>Develop</u>, implement, monitor and review procedures that help maintain, manage and enhance the environmental and public health of the shire.
- Consider and address climate change impact on environmental and public health programs in accordance with Council Climate Change Policy, Risk Management Policy, and Climate Resilience Strategy.
- Engage with the community to improve the environmental and public health of the shire.
- <u>Undertake environmental and public health functions with reference to the legislated principles of</u> ecologically sustainable development, protection of public health and safety, protection of the environment_z and management of risk.

<u>Council recognises that individuals, industry and community also have responsibilities for environmental and public health, including:</u>

- eEnsuring that their own actions contribute to the protection of the environment in the interests of their own health and the health of others
- pParticipating in decision making processes on matters likely to affect environment and health
 mMaking use of opportunities and practices that minimise adverse impacts on human health, and reduce risk of pollution.
