### <del>1.2</del>1.1 Scope

This policy prescribes the processes implemented to facilitate and encourage the development and continued delivery of arts and cultural services across the Bega Valley Shire.

The scope of this policy demonstrates direct commitment to the following strategic guiding principles:

- Accountable | Proactive consultation and engagement internally between business areas and externally with key stakeholders
- Transparent | Commitment to open communication; nurturing a trusting and supportive partnership with community, local businesses and funding partners
- Equitable and inclusive | Strong consideration of the needs of all stakeholders; commitment to building a
  connection with stakeholders upon trust and respect; nurturing a culture of collaboration, consultation and
  communication in council business practices and service delivery

### 1.31.2 Purpose

To recognise the importance of arts and culture in contributing to civic pride, belonging, <u>community wellbeing</u>, commemoration, celebration, sense of place, <u>cultural tourism</u> and social development of the community.

# 1.41.3 Definitions

NilArts is a broad term that encompasses a range of traditional artforms such a visual arts (e.g. painting, sculpture, photography etc), music (both recorded and performed), performing arts (e.g. dance, theatre), literature (books and other written works), and craft and design, as well as creative industries such as film, television and radio, fashion design, software development and interactive digital content, and architecture.

<u>Culture refers to the characteristics and knowledge of a particular group of people, defined by everything from language, kinship and religion, to cuisine, social habits, traditions and arts. It can be seen as the growth of group identity fostered by social patterns unique to the group. Culture, therefore, also embraces heritage and heritage-related assets and activity.</u>

This policy recognises that the arts represent a creative expression that is influenced by culture, which in turn, helps to shape culture.

### 3.1 Policy statement

Bega Valley Shire Council will-recognises the importance of arts and culture by:

- recognising and promoting the contribution made by the original custodians of the lands and waters to the arts and culture of the shire
- maintaining and enhancing the natural and cultural environments <u>within the shire</u> for the benefit of future generations
- developing and enhancing, through the organisation's cultural facilities (Regional Gallery / South East Centre for Contemporary Art, Bega Valley Libraries and Bega Valley Commemorative Civic Centre)-, a viable, accessible and relevant arts and cultural program
- contributing to South East Arts Inc as a peak industry organisation who advocates for and works closely with local professional creatives to provide development, economic and presentation opportunities
- optimising participation in cultural activities that are affordable, available and accessible to all within the community
- fostering social tolerance and facilitate shared community experience and expression
- encouraging excellence in cultural expression
- recognising and promoting the diverse cultural identity of the shire
- maintaining a range of community facilities such as halls and sportsgrounds that enable and support arts and culture activity across the shire
- implementing the adopted Arts and Culture Plan in line with resourcing and priorities
- recognising and promoting the contribution of creative industries and cultural tourism.


# 3.2 Responsibilities
