## 1.1 Scope

The policy demonstrates direct commitment to the following strategic guiding principles:

- Accountable | Ceommitment to risk management and compliance and proactive consultation and engagement organisation wide
- Transparent | Delecision making processes are clearly outlined, including how a decision is made and who is involved
- Responsive | Ccommitment to serve the needs of the entire community
- Equitable and linclusive | Sstrong consideration of the needs of all stakeholders
- Effective and Efficient | Celear connection between policy and implementation

# 1.2 Purpose

- To display strong leadership to the community through the implementation of sustainability initiatives.
- To reduce the environmental impact of Council's operations and activities.
- To integrate the principles of sustainability into all Council functions and activities to achieve a healthy, clean and sustainable environment.
- To reduce financial costs associated with resource consumption across Council's many assets and activities.

# 3 Implementation

## 3.1 Policy statement

Bega Valley Shire Council will systematically address the environmental sustainability of Council operations and activities by:

- applying the principles of sustainability to all decision making functions and activities
- reviewing all policies, processes and procedures to facilitate capacity to deliver triple bottom line performance and improvement across Council operations
- underpinning Council's commitment to sustainability through the application of the <u>established</u> principles adopted by all levels of government in the <u>National ESD Strategy</u> of Ecologically Sustainable Development (ESD):
  - a. Conservation of biological diversity and ecological integrity Council will maintain and where possible enhance the range of native plants, animals and their habitats to protect the health of our local environment.
  - b. Precautionary principle Council will actively manage environmental risks-
  - c. Inter-generational equity Council will ensure that the health diversity and productivity of our environment is maintained and/or enhanced for future generations
  - d. Integrated decision making Council will ensure that short and long term economic, social and environmental considerations are integrated into all decision making-
- improved valuation and pricing of environmental resources Council will ensure that environmental factors
  are considered in asset management and service provision, and will also ensure the principle of 'polluter pays'
  will apply where the costs of containment, abatement or avoidance of pollution or waste are paid by the
  polluter.

#### 3.2.1 Elected Council

Ensure decision-making considers the principles outlined in this policy.



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#### 3.2.2 Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Leadership Executive Group (LEG)

Ensure all directorates actively work to reduce the environmental impact of their operations, service provision and long term planning on the Bega Valley Shire environment.

#### 3.2.3 All Directorates

Actively work to reduce the environmental impact of their operations, service provision and long term planning on the Bega Valley Shire environment.

Ensure environmental sustainability is a key consideration in all decision making, operations and service provision.

#### 3.2.4 Environment and Sustainability section

Actively work across Council to review and reduce the environmental impact of Council's operations.
